## *From Your Pastor...*

It has been an interesting year here at College Park! We set the tone for the year by stepping out in faith and approving the plan for renovating the educational building, and began accepting funds for that project. We were looking at possible new construction, but there was understandable reluctance to jump into a building project that may be too large, given the financial landscape at the time. As spring arrived, we were still resolute with plans for renovation, and our Architectural Fund Raising Committee (AFRC) asked for a pre-capital campaign assessment to gauge the church's willingness and ability to undertake a capital campaign for renovations and possible new construction. With the report from that assessment, the AFRC brought a motion to the church earlier this month to begin a capital cam-

paign this fall to raise the money necessary to complete the educational building renovations as soon as possible. We also hope to raise additional money that could be used to build a new recreational ministry facility that would attach to the educational building. Our Facilities Update Committee will bring a recommendation about what that building will look like and the function it will serve in the month of September, and we will have a Called Conference to make the decision regarding new construction. To these committees, I want to say "thank you" for their hard work...and a special "thank you" also to those who have agreed to work on our capital campaign!

### **“History Highlight”**

Construction of the new sanctuary began soon after the ground-breaking, and the basement part of the building was first used for Sunday School in October 1958. A Loyalty Dinner was held in

November 1959 to raise funds to continue the construction which was suspended in July of that year. The fund-raising campaign and dinner were successful and construction continued so that the cornerstone-laying service was held on April 24, 1960. Rev. Foy Martin is shown in the photo as he sealed the sanctuary cornerstone in place during this special service of thanksgiving and praise.
