A NOTE FROM MARY



"It's not fair!" We've all felt it. We've all said it. Sometimes the cry is over something miniscule. Other times over matters of great importance to us. And it's true: life is *not* fair. However, if we take an honest assessment of our lives, we must confess that we come out on the blessed side of fair. Most of us have the basic necessities of life. We are not in need of food, clothing, or shelter. We might wish for better food, fancier clothes, or a bigger house, but the fact that we have the luxury to think on what we want instead of what we need is in itself a blessing. Our trip to New York reinforced that for me. We are blessed beyond measure.

We've been discussing the names of God in our Monday Bible study using a book by Mary Kassian called "*Knowing God by Name*." A couple of weeks ago, we discussed that God is the "God of all grace."
