#### NOTE FROM MARY



Currently, our Monday morning Bible study is discussing Taste and See by Margaret Feinberg, a book teaching about the many food references in the Bible. As we have studied (so far) about fish and fruit and bread, one of the recurring themes has been that of community. Whether it is manna in the desert, the feeding of the 5,000, a miraculous catch of fish, or the Last Supper, God feeds his people in community, and in community, they experience His love and provision. We experience His love in community as well. It's why we are commanded not to forsake gathering with other believers. We learn from each other, we are encouraged by one another, we celebrate and mourn together. But is community found in eating? Think about it. What happens when we meet around the table for a meal? We share our day, we share our stories, we laugh together, and relationships are deepened. It is significant that when Jesus said, "Do this in remembrance of me" it was around the table.

We joke a lot about Baptists eating, and we do like to eat. At College Park we have plenty of opportunities to combine food with fellowship: Wednesday evenings, College Parkers, Grub Club, to name a few. We often look at them as opportunities to fill our bellies, but how often do we think of them as opportunities to fill our souls? We have the chance to make our table time a time of fellowship that goes deeper than triviality. We can use that time to build relationships. It may even be a chance to build new relationships (I'll just drop that one there and let you ponder it...). We can choose to let our time at the table be one that builds up not just our individual bodies, but the body of Christ. I encourage you to take some time, whether it is church scheduled or on your own, to spend time with others at the table. Maybe invite someone new to share a meal with you. Take the time to allow God to nourish both body and soul.
