During our Passion Q & A Coffee House, there was a good question asked that I wanted to answer in a more public way. The question concerned the dates that the gospels are reported to have been written. Most evangelical scholars (and by the way, when I quote scholars and theologians and don't make a specification regarding their relative position, they most likely represent evangelical scholarship) agree that Paul's letters were written between 49–67AD, with Galatians being the earliest, and 2 Timothy probably the latest. The dates for the writing of the gospels are debated a little more heavily, depending on our understanding of implied references to historical events that apparently were happening or already had happened. So with these parameters: Mark is seen as the earliest, with dating as early as 40AD, but probably written between 55-65AD, 70AD on the high end; Matthew typically is dated mid-60's, with the high end sometimes stated around 100AD; Luke is thought to be pretty solid with an early 60's dating, with Acts completed by 70AD; and John is the latest with dates varying between 85-100AD. We know from other sources that the gospels were already known and circulating by early second century! As much emphasis as was placed on literature, if they had not been accurate, they simply would not have survived...there were too many people still alive that had lived the stories!

We can have all faith that the gospels were written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit by those who knew and walked with our Lord! We can declare their truths with confidence!
