During this week (on April 17th to be exact) in the year 1521, Martin Luther appeared before the Diet of Worms to defend his positions. He stood in simple garb before Emperor Charles, the royal advisors, the leaders of the church, and dignitaries from various nations. Apparently overawed, Luther seemed nervous and requested a recess. During the night, he strengthened himself in prayer and personal worship of the Father. The next morning, April 18th, he appeared again before the Diet; this time bold, heroic, and undaunted, saying, "I cannot and will not recant anything, since it is unsafe and dangerous to do anything against the conscience."

Luther proclaimed boldly that all believers are in themselves priests upon acceptance of the atoning act of Jesus on the cross. This "new" concept of "Priesthood of the Believer" (a foundational belief of Baptists) was contrary to the practices of the church, and placed him in direct conflict with the very church/state institution. Frederick the Wise hid Luther in the castle of the Wartburg for nearly a year, during which Luther translated the whole New Testament into German. Luther's translation rolled off the press in September, 1522, and nothing did more to make the common man his own interpreter of the scriptures!

God can use each of us to change history, but it begins in prayer, and worship of the Father of our risen Savior!
