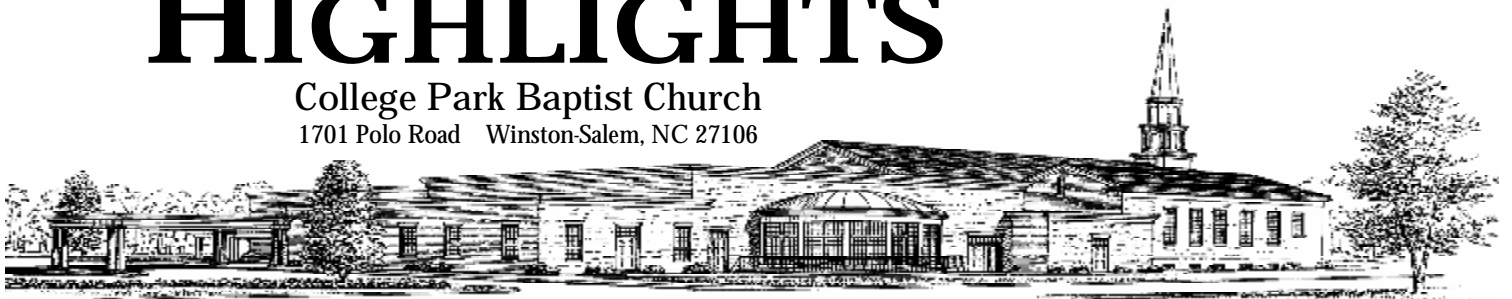

Jeff's Notes

Let me give you an update on our plans for new choir robes. As we have been talking about, the Music Committee feels strongly (and choir members agree) that there is a need for new choir robes for our *Sanctuary Choir* (our old ones have served us for nearly 20 years), and they also feel that we should purchase robes for *Ainesis* and our two children's choirs, *Sing for God* and *Psalm 8:2*. The total amount of money needed is approximately \$11,000 (total cost will vary slightly depending on exact robe sizes for children and the stoles that are yet to be chosen). You can see below the updated amount we have received to date. In order to take advantage of a promotional discount, we have purchased 50 adult robes with funds already received. We can take advantage of a similar promotion on the children's robes if we place the remaining order by August. Robes are so important for a choir because they stand as a symbol of the unity with which a choir sacrificially prepares for and leads a congregation in worship. In more practical ways, robes assure that as our "family" members lead us, the concerns of appearance and appropriate attire are alleviated and more emphasis and effort can be put toward offering our very best to God through our music and our example. I hope that if you haven't taken the chance to give towards this important ministry, you will do so in the next few weeks.
