It was a cute moment that God used to remind me of something extraordinary.

In our modern day America, tired seems to be a common theme throughout society. It seems that we run ourselves ragged, going from one "priority" to another. If it is not family events, then it is work requirements or anything in between. We are just worn down and we need to take rest. God knows this and wants us to focus on Him and his priorities for our life. In Him we find strength and rest. Consider the scripture passage in Revelation 3:8:

⁸I know your deeds. See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut. I know that you have little strength, yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name.

Are you running in circles trying to keep up? Are you tired of being tired? God knows your struggles and holds the answers for those who knock on his door. Come and find rest. He is ready. Are you?
