Sanctuary Flowers

The beautiful flowers in our Sanctuary today are in memory of Wes Morgan and in honor of his testimony to the world. His family is grateful for his love and the blessing that he was.

Litany of Reflection

Leader: The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge.

Choir: There is no speech or language where their voice is not heard. Their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world.

All: "But what about you? Who do you say that I am?"

Leader: We all stumble in many ways. If anyone is never at fault in what he says, he is a perfect man, able to keep his whole body in check.

All: "But what about you? Who do you say that I am?"

Leader: Likewise the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider that a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole person, sets the whole course of his life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell.

Choir: All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles, and creatures of the sea are being tamed and have been tamed by man, but no man can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.

All: "But what about you? Who do you say I am?"

Choir: With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in God's likeness. Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be.

Leader: The fear of the Lord is pure, enduring forever. The ordinances of the Lord are sure and altogether righteous, in keeping them there is great reward. Keep your servant from willful sins; may they not rule over me. Then will I be blameless, innocent of great transgression. "But what about you? Who do you say I am?"

All: You are the Christ. May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing in your sight, O Lord, my Rock and my Redeemer.
