A COVENANT OF DEDICATION

Leader: We are here today to present these children to the church and to consecrate them to God. Who brings them for this holy purpose?
Parents: We, the parents, do.
Leader: What do we affirm about these children?
Parents: We affirm that each child is made in the image of God, and is a child of God by creation; that each is loved and will be included in the experiences of this congregation; and that children are God's gifts to us in whom we take delight.
Leader: As these infants grow into childhood, what will we tell them about their heritage?
People: We will tell them about God who created the world; about Abraham and Sarah, the founders of our faith; about Moses who led our ancestors out of bondage; about Ruth's example of faithfulness; and about the prophets who spoke courageously for God against the superficial values of their day. We will tell them about Jesus the Christ in whom salvation is offered; about the woman at the well who experienced God's healing grace; about the Apostles who grew beyond comfort and familiarity as they sought to follow Jesus; and about the worship and mission of the Church.
Leader: What will we hope for in these children?
People: We will look to the day when these children will gather with us at the Lord's Table, when they will declare faith in Jesus the Christ, confirm the heritage which we will pass along, and come as adults to choose full commitment to God's will and work.
Leader: Do you as the parents of these children assume your primary responsibility for keeping them in touch with such hopes and expectations?
Parents: Yes, we accept this responsibility.
Leader: And do you, the congregation, pledge to work toward creating a nurturing Christian environment for all our children?
People: Yes, we do, for they belong to us.
Leader: Then, may God be with us.
All: And help us! Amen!
