

From Your Pastor...

Philippians 2:12-13 reads:

Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose.

Our Mission ...

I have often heard verse 12 misquoted, or quoted out of context as a proof text for “works theology,” or salvation by good works. This is not at all what Paul was trying to reinforce to the readers at the church in Philippi. He had just finished writing about how we, as believers, should imitate Christ in our behavior, and he continues to say that we should work out our salvation with fear and trembling because God is working through us according to His purpose.

So this is not salvation through works, but the developing of our discipleship by submitting ourselves completely to God’s purpose. As we “work out” the muscles in our physical body, they become stronger. In like fashion, as we “work out” our spiritual muscles through service, our salvation experience is enhanced by our growing relationship with God as we recognize and follow His leadership. Worshipping and serving...both essential to a developing faith! How are your “spiritual muscles?” My prayer for you this week is that you will seek God’s leadership into a new area of service for the sake of His kingdom!
