"The Arm of the Church at Crystal Lake"

On last Sunday morning the arm of the church which meets at Crystal Lake had 101 in attendance. Mr. Irving Carlyle taught the Bible Class and Rev. Walter L. Warfford preached at the eleven o'clock hour.

The Sunday School Superintendent, J. High Davis, is leading in the study of God's Word in a fine way. This group of consecrated Christians are working hard to establish a work in that community which will be a source of strength in the future. The church is interested in its arm and will support and nourish it.

This article was preserved and reprinted in our church history, (College Park Baptist Church: A New Testament Church 1949-1999, by Helen A. Howard), and of course is a reference to the beginnings of College Park. It is duly noted in our history how much this group of believers sacrificed to establish a base of ministry in this community, and how the church reached out to the families in this area. They were resourceful and determined, but most of all they prayed for God's help as they sought to reach people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Can we learn from the past? Certainly. Will we? That will be determined by each one of us...
