“History Highlight”
 The new sanctuary building definitely changed the look of the church property, both from the front, as we saw previously, and from the back of the building. In the above photo, the sanctuary is at the left, with two doors that enter via stairs from the parking lot. The building at the right was the former church office and the choir room. Access to the building was by a set of stairs (not shown) at the far right. Today this section is occupied by the church library. The middle section above is the connector between the library and the sanctuary.
