There is a temptation for us as believers to occasionally represent our lives as a series of spiritual highs, to be quite vocal when all is well and when God is easily seen at work in the world around us and, conversely, to be silent when life is difficult and painful. To be fair, there are ministries built on the idea that if we just have faith, all will be well, that the life of faith is one of mountaintop experiences and an overwhelming sense of God's constant presence. Intellectually, I think most of us know that God does not guarantee a life without pain. If we've read scripture at all, I think we realize that Jesus also dealt with pain and frustration and disappointment. Yet, when we are in the midst of a storm, it is easy to hide our doubt and struggles, fearful of how others might interpret it. However, in doing so, we miss out on so much. In making ourselves vulnerable, we give others opportunity to be real too. We get to experience the wisdom of shared experience, of hearing the stories of those who have come out the other side and can look back and see where God was at work in the storm. We receive prayer and encouragement from places we never expected. When we are real with each other about our struggles, we allow each other to be the hands and feet God intended us to be, building up the body for His glory.

Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) are more valuable than ever. With the doubling of the standard deduction and the suspension and limitation of many other deductions, far fewer taxpayers are likely to itemize. This means that far fewer will be able take advantage of the deduction for charitable giving. With a QCD, you can use the standard deduction and get a tax break for your charitable contributions. Is a QCD right for you? You must be age 70 ½ and the funds from your IRA must go directly to a qualified charity. You are also limited to \$100,000 annually.
