

A NOTE FROM MARY



I was talking this week in the office about some music I had been listening to, and I mentioned, "They are all about singing about the cross and salvation through the blood." Later, I had to wonder why that struck me as worth noting. And maybe that is because it is unusual. These days, we don't often talk about the cross. We skip over the cross and go straight to the resurrected Jesus. We don't often sing the cross hymns. We sing those hymns for Holy Week, and we focus for a couple of days on the cross, but sometimes even that is uncomfortable to us. Is it our own discomfort that keeps us from focusing on the cross? I'm not convinced. I am sure there are those who would throw the accusation that perhaps we are trying to make Christianity more palatable for the not-yet believer, but I am not sure that is it either. Honestly, I'd like to think that most of us are daily, acutely aware of Christ's sacrifice; however, I think it is sometimes easier to focus on God's sustenance, provision, and mercy rather than ugliness of His sacrifice. I think that as we focus on the ugliness of His sacrifice, our hearts know that grace does not come cheaply. Our hearts know that there is no way to repay that gift. Our hearts know that such a sacrifice requires something of us. I think as we focus on the cross we are reminded, as the old hymn states: Love so amazing, so divine, Demands my soul, my life, my all.
