

A NOTE FROM MARY



It has been my experience over the years that appliances never break. Rather, they break in groups, in rapid succession, at the most inconvenient times. As a military wife, this usually meant they broke right after Jamie left for a 4-6 week deployment. Life can be a lot like broken appliances. It seems that the circumstances that threaten to break us sometimes seem to happen in groupings with no breathing room to process our feelings and no control over the circumstances. Not only does life not seem fair, it seems like it might be out to get us. These are the days when faith is a hard choice and when trust is difficult. We aren't able to see what is ahead (and might be afraid to find out!). We don't know how God is using our difficult times to shape us until we look back on them, usually from a distance. In those times, I am comforted in reading the Psalms. I appreciate the psalmists' honesty as they cry out to God. I appreciate their complaints and their pleas as they ask for mercy. And in the times when my faith is at its end, I hold tightly to the honest, broken confessions of those who, in worship of God, are able to declare, "I am confident of this: I will see the goodness of God in the land of the living." Praise God His faithfulness in all situations is greater than my feeble faith.

The Bread of Life Food Pantry Collection



The Bread of Life Food Pantry is a ministry of the Triad Church Network (formally Pilot Mountain Baptist Association) that provides food for the needy and hungry, and they also provide a place where people come to receive a

smile, a song, and words of encouragement. Each client is prayed with and gets a sampling of spiritual food. Usually, boxes include some type of Christian literature. Most clients are senior adults.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD:


We are continuing to collect items each month for our Operation Christmas Child shoe box event.



Recommendation for Minister to Children: The Search Committee is excited to recommend Leigh Ann Pernell for the part-time position of Minister to Children for College Park Baptist Church. After encouragement by members of our church, Leigh Ann prayerfully considered applying for the minister to children position and, ultimately, felt led to pursue this opportunity. Leigh Ann has worked with the children of College Park for over 30 years and has been a blessing to our children and our church. Leigh Ann's desire is to be a part of the vision of College Park and actively work to nurture and train our children in Christian values and to proclaim the Good News in the way we worship, study, minister and live our lives.

Recommendation for Communications Specialist: The Search Committee recommends William Worley for the part-time Communications Specialist for College Park Baptist Church. Wil has extensive experience in producing quality worship experiences.
