The day started with a trip to the Charleston Baptist Association where we met up with our friend, Jimmy Creech of Charleston Outreach. We then went to the first project of the day where the team made quick work of finishing the shingle work on the roof and other various things. Everyone did their jobs with joy and laughter.

Once the first house was finished, the team traveled to another home where a punch list was waiting for us to complete. This home was on the site of a project our college mission team did two years ago, when demolition was the name of the game. This time, our team is helping to put the final touch on a brand new home. It has been exciting for the ones who were here two years ago to see how far the home has come.

While at the site, we noticed that someone put the scripture reference Isaiah 58:12 on one of the saw horses at the new house. No one on the team could immediately bring that verse to mind, and when we returned to the hotel, this is what we read: "Your people will rebuild the ancient ruins and will raise up the age-old foundations; you will be called Repairer of Broken Walls, Restorer of Streets with Dwellings." The context of the passage reminds us that it should be our desire to put God first in our lives. When we place God first in our lives and put His desires above our own, we then desire to do something greater than we could on our own. Our team has put God in the center of our lives this week and they are helping to rebuild what was once destroyed — both physically and spiritually. I am proud of each person on this trip, and I am honored to be a part of such a special effort.

I wonder if there is something that has been destroyed or at least damaged in your own life. Are there any ruins where your heart once stood strong?
