From Your Pastor...

It is that time of year again...time to nominate deacons to serve on the "active board" for a three-year term. So important is this concept that our church constitution makes a point of saying:

The scriptural charge in 1 Timothy, chapter three, makes it clear that Deacons are to be *servant leaders*. It is not a position of power, but of service and humility, just as our Savior demonstrated.

Now that I think about it, all of us are called to be servant leaders in our own way, according to our own giftedness. That is what makes the Body of Christ so special, and each of us are vital to the success of the whole Body.

So this autumn as the leaves begin to show their colors, it's time for us, as Christians, to show our true colors and serve our Lord and each other with glad hearts! Pray that God will show you how He wants to use you in His service!

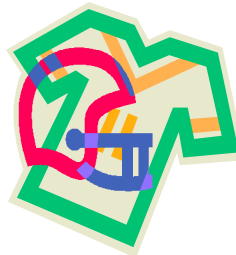
