As Billy Graham's three-week Los Angeles evangelistic campaign neared its end, local crusade organizers wanted to extend the meetings. Billy was hesitant, and he asked God for a sign. The next morning, October 17, 1949, at 4:30, he was awakened by a phone call. It was cowboy entertainer, Stuart Hamblen, in tears. He drove to Billy's hotel and accepted Christ as his Savior. That was the sign Billy needed to extend the meetings. Stuart excitedly told the story of his conversion on his radio show, and the local newspapers picked up the story. Soon all Los Angeles was buzzing about the Billy Graham meetings. The resulting publicity launched a half-century of mass evangelism virtually unparalleled in Christendom.


