College Park Baptist Church Purpose (Article II of Church Constitution)

- From the perspective of the member and the congregation, where the answers intersect determines the basis of a vital Long Range Ministry.
- The intersections will be the basis of our inspired and shared Journey over the LRP.
- Depending on how you view the church and your walk, you will see various forms of our future as managers/stewards of God's will.
- In total-it is not about us, but about finding, sharing, serving, encouraging, and living the purposed life.
- It is as much about prayer, patience, love and caring in His name as it is about making disciples.

A Mission of Purposeful Spiritual Stewardship

o The Purpose of the LRP

- 1. Re-connect with our surrounding community where they live, work, relax and seek enrichment;
- 2. Seek meaningful and encouraging interactions among the membership;
- Inspire and encourage strong spirit-led lives to meet the challenges of the family and individuals seeking and serving Christ;
- 4. Create avenues of discipleship and worship that nurture growth and meaning compatible with the time and format of our families, community and calling;
- 5. Establishing a purposeful Christled life through development and opportunities to grow "spiritual fruits"

Examples of Change we seek:

- Family center campus that provides attractive, secure facilities with engaging family experiences;
- Transcend the isolated worship centers of Sunday School, Worship in Sanctuary to blending worship to our daily lives together and with others;
- Active local mission based on serving and caring;
- Helping each member find their spiritual calling;
- 5. Bring recreation and activities for centers for children, youth and adults to engage in sports and activities for developing respect and support.

Let's look at the detail comments Spiritual Growth

Examples of Comments

- Assist members to seek their journey with God and encourage them to grow;
- Study Groups;
- Exposure to a balance of Spiritual leaders and experiences outside of this community;
- Joint Programs with Chinese Ministry, Japanese, etc.;
- In-home bible study and spiritual development programs with young mothers, homebound, and small groups;
- Prayer teams
- Mission for spiritual development and service;

Let's look at the detail comments Caring and Outreach

o Examples:

- Provide "in-gatherings" for believers to worship as well as fellowship;
- Create methods/means to meet the needs of parents of young children;
- Be a part of our "neighborhood" by serving them (repairs, training, transportation, cleaning, activities,...)
- Provide viable community support programs and lead with care and service.
- Minister to shut-ins; assist with home repairs, meals;
- Worship programs that connect with community;
- Be a good neighbor;
- Be connected to all generations and connect generations.

Let's look at the detail comments: Family Ministry

Examples:

- Actively support a caring ministry of believers and nonbelievers for children, youth and families;
- Boost family ministry to reach families with young children;
- Provide a flexible, but purposeful campus and programs for families;
- Provide active recreational program and campus solutions for youth and families;
- Upgrade college Ministry to connect members away at college and those college students near-by;
- Expand Mother's morning outreach;
- Encourage and inspire the "wedge generation" who are caring for older parents while managing a family;

A Viable Campus Plan

o Examples:

- Nearly all aspects of the LRP comments point to the compelling need to update the physical campus layout;
- Provide a core children-, youth- and family-centric facility;
- Increase the use of the campus by engaging the community through effective programs and fellowship;
- Facility upgrades need to incorporate a design that includes key security enhancements and meets the expectations of the community, visitors and members;
- Create an on-going facilities "care and use" program to keep campus fresh and current;
- Campus design and use that will blend with the neighborhood and not overwhelm it.

Let's look at the detail comments Equipping and Encouraging

o Examples:

- Assist members and community in finding their spiritual gifts;
- Offer experiences and programs for members to discover Christ and seek deeper understanding of His calling to "follow Him."
- Encourage members to "go out and serve."
- Encourage members and the community to deal with the challenges of life, health, children, parents, etc.;
- Equip and encourage members to serve;
- Learn how to "be there" in goods times and bad;

Be seen as Christ Disciples by our actions first, not our words;

- Be good neighbors;
- Members seek and find their own purpose and own their journey;
- Encourage and establish an on-going Team IAM program that individuals and groups can lead/serve;
- Open the doors of the church and have regularly scheduled programs that help people with their everyday issues including; young married couples, couples, families, singles, children, youth, and seniors.
- Open the doors of the church to the community around us;
- Reduce the structure requirements and increase the depth of one's ministry;
- Help members be comfortable and inspired to "walk" a Christled life seven days a week;
- Be a neighbor to our neighbors;

Shift the focus from time-driven schedules to life encouraging experiences and helping each to find their calling;

- Review, evaluate and recommend a significant reduction in the committee structure that is needed to operate the church;
- Create, inspire, encourage each member and visitor constantly to seek their calling and to pursue that calling;
- Be spirit-led and joyful;
- Worship and Bible studies that reach and invite families, neighbors and members to want to be there;
- Adapt to the realities that many people contact the church via the web and seek inspiration, worship and support outside the church rather than inside the church;
- Create a campus that supports a concentrated child- and youth focus by actions vs. structure: recreation, activities, experiences, mission trips.

Re-focus the shape and content of the physical campus to support outreach to families, children, and youth while sustaining adult congregational resources;

- Our campus must change in both content, presentation and orientation to reach the community;
- Make the transition to a family-focused ministry;
- Campus must focus on interaction among members/attendees;
- Campus must not only be physically safe, but a place that is inviting to members and visitors. A places that feels inviting, encouraging and supportive.
- Provide a recreation center for children, youth and families;
- Update the storage and flexibility of meeting spaces to always be fresh, clean and present a sense of readiness.

Simplify how we operate the church to free the congregation from structure to become the life of the church

- Take care of the business functions more efficiently with fewer meetings, fewer sessions, fewer man-hours, less time and less paperwork;
- Encourage volunteers to lead and do, to eliminate the duplication of efforts and free members and staff to connect;
- Recognize the lay leadership by supporting and encouraging people to take new roles;
- Establish formal evaluation tools and end dates for all committee members and tasks;

Make the priority of purposeful life of ministry the central focus of the member and the congregation;

- Begin immediately with a focus on helping each member to hear and experience their near-term calling;
- Encourage prayer time in all members' lives;
- Assist in helping form small prayer circles for caring, sharing, trusting and accountability;
- Seek humble server roles at home and in the community;
- Lead with discipleship and encouragement to be a loving spirit to all;
- Focus bible-study to provide the tools we need as we seek to serve our neighbors as we would want to be served.

Be joyful and bring praise and glory to God in all things;

- Celebrate the blessings;
- Immediately begin to celebrate and encourage the gifts you see in others;
- Give thanks to God;
- Pool resources, skills, gifts and talents of members and community to help others regularly;
- Build on the experience of Wednesday evenings by adding multiple and external gatherings that would attract more members and non-members;

<u>Care for each other and those near us and called</u> <u>to be near;</u>

- Discipleship and prayer circles for encouragement of those in need;
- Inspire and support each member to take a daily journey to reach-out and care for those nearest to them;
- Seek and create meaningful opportunities of trips, programs, education forums to help people with their challenges;
- Build viable tools for daily living that address the opportunities and issues facing everyone from children to senior adults.

Have Congregational Worship that inspires and nurtures all of God's children to be at home and a place for those seeking Christ;

- Evaluate and create worship gatherings that are inviting for the community;
- Create small worship opportunities that are off-campus and are meaningful for our neighbors;
- Create family worship experiences;
- Re-focus the care program for members, non-members, and those in need;
- Establish meaningful care and connections with members and non-members who have suffered from prior experience in the process of church and church-life.

Wrap-up of the LRP

- o Key Notes:
- Start immediately with helping our neighbors;
- Establish a campus-wide plan to support full family ministry;
- Encourage each member to seek their spiritual gifts and bring their fruits into use;
- 4. Lead by Example in caring, compassion and assistance;
- 5. Focus members' time to using their talents, "doing" rather than "processing";
- Build an active mission and service training in experiencing and risk-taking to reach those not served through traditional church;
- 5. Shift the effort from structure to serving in our ministry;
- 8. Build an effective communications program to encourage involvement, inclusion and preparation;

- Develop and adopt a campus wide plan within 6 months and requirements to operate and staff accordingly.
- Implement new campus and/or facility within 12 months of campus plan.

- Assess Congregational Worship times, programs and recommend a total worship program(s) that invites communities and builds spiritual foundations.
- 6. Establish a practice of "keeping the campus fresh and uncluttered".
