

A NOTE FROM MARY

I was looking over the order of service for a funeral that would start in a few minutes when the organist began playing "Jesus, Savior, Pilot Me." It's a hymn you don't see in most modern hymnals, but one that I learned as an undergraduate student at Campbell University. It had been sung at the first ever chapel service at Buies Creek Academy and was sung every year for founder's day. I knew it well, and smiled to myself at the remembrances it brought. This hymn was immediately followed by "Here, I Am, Lord." The organist had no way of knowing that particular hymn was sung yearly at Campbell University Divinity School's commissioning service, and, consequently, at my ordination service as well. The two hymns together brought powerful memories of being called and prepared by God to serve Him. They had great meaning to me.

It comes as no surprise, I am sure, that over the years music has spoken to me in lots of ways. There are hymns and songs that bring happy memories, others that accompanied hard times. I have memories of hearing my Grandieu sing and of singing for her with my siblings. I remember church camp songs, youth group songs, and solos sung for weddings and funerals. I know I am not alone in this, as over the years people have shared their song memories with me: love songs from their youth, songs from the funerals of loved ones, songs they sang repeatedly during difficult periods, songs shared around family pianos. Music and memory often goes hand in hand. (And sometimes music outlasts memories as minds no longer capable of other memories remember the words of song.) Music reminds us of the seasons of our lives. It accompanies so many of our memories, and I think that is one reason that God's word tells us to sing. Scripture itself contains songs of amazement, victory and celebration, and songs of questioning and lament. And we're encouraged to sing. Why? Because it is important to remember where we have come from and what God has brought us through. We need to look back in amazement of how far God has carried us and be reminded that He is carrying us still. We need to know that we are not alone in our triumphs or our pain. We need to express all of our emotions to the One who has carried us and continues to carry us. We sing to acknowledge our God in thankfulness, praise, and petition for both the past and the future.
