A NOTE FROM MARY



For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom his whole family in heaven and earth derives its name. Add to that picture the fruit of the Spirit, the outward manifestation of the love we have been nourished by. These fruit are also rooted in His love. If the measurement of your growth in Christ is love, how do you measure up? Are you words loving? Is your heart forgiving? I encourage you to be rooted in the love of Christ, so that others might know His love through you.



And so is our organization which strives to involve women, children, and preschoolers to respond to their world as well as to the world far away. Such a response is possible as WMU seeks creative ways to involve their members in studying about missions, doing mission action and personal witnessing, and supporting missions through prayer and financial gifts.

Recently, College Park WMU members/groups have:

- provided paper products to SECA House and Ronald McDonald House
- provided school uniforms for children are Speas Elementary.
- made cosmetic bags for children at Children's Home
- made and packaged cookies and snacks for families at Ronald McDonald House
- made over 1000 cloth "Dolls and Bears on Mission" which have been given to children in crisis situations to assist them in learning about God's love for them


