One of my favorite things in getting to know people in divinity school was hearing the stories of how they got there. There were plenty of young men and women who just always knew they were going in ministry, but I was fascinated by the large number of individuals who had very successful professional careers in the secular sector who were giving up those careers to follow a call. Often that call was a desire, passion, or need that God had placed in

their hearts years before and had continued to grow in them over time. God places those things in us for a reason. Pay attention to those things which stir your heart. Find ways to come alongside God's work in those areas. Enlistment Committee:

Did you know ...

that College Park has an Enlistment Committee that works hard to fulfill a variety of positions of leadership at the church. Their purpose is to enlist and recommend to the church all volunteer workers who are church elected (except for Deacons).

This is a rotating committee of three persons nominated by the deacons, elected by the church to serve three years from January to December. Persons elected to this Committee are not eligible to serve again until at least one year has expired.

These three elected members nominate the following general officers:

Director of Sunday School; Director of Discipleship Training; Director of Baptist Men; and Director of Women's Missionary Union. When elected, these general officers, or representatives of the aforementioned ministry groups, join the committee of three to form a working committee charged with nominating church elected leadership.

The members of this committee will enlist qualified persons to vacant leadership positions, based on their gifts to serve in that capacity.

Church officers and committee chairs are elected by the church for one-year terms. All church committee positions are for three-year terms unless stated otherwise. Nominations for all places of service are presented for election at regular/called business meetings. The individual must consent to serve on the committee or office before being presented to the church for election.

Each person nominated must be a member of College Park Baptist Church or a non-member who has demonstrated engagement in the life of the church. When a non-member is recommended for a committee or council, these names will be reviewed by the active deacon board, for engagement, prior to being presented to the church for election.



The Enlistment Committee will be contacting individuals to serve in a variety of positions at the church over the coming months. Please be in prayer for how God can use you to serve in the ministries of the church. We look forward to seeing how God will use your gifts and talents!
