Now I understand that sometimes it doesn't seem as simple as is stated by our Lord, and yet it is! The thing we often get hung up on is the accountability issue. How do we know that the people we want to get help will truly be helped ... and is that the people that God desires to be helped by us? Let's not make this more difficult than it needs to be. In our situation, I have known the family we are working with for over 50 years. Much like our relationships that led us to supply emergency resources two days after the hurricane (literally), we are working with trusted partners who have all the local knowledge that makes this partnership efficient and has maximum impact potential! I am convinced God will continue to bless us, as we bless others in His name!

My prayer for each of us is that 2025 will be a great year of living out our mission lifestyle!




