A NOTE FROM MARY

Occasionally I get asked about resources for Bible study, either personal study or in preparation for corporate study. We've had some discussion about resources in our Sunday night discipleship class recently as we've talked about the importance of studying scripture, so I thought in coming weeks I would share some of the resources I use regularly. These are not exhaustive, and I am pretty sure if you would ask any of the ministers, they would have would have other resources to add to the list. However, here is my starting point:

Firstly, I would encourage you to read a passage from several different translations. We all have favorites, and certainly most of us have one that most of our memory verses are memorized from; however, when studying, it is helpful to

compare the different wordings of scripture to bring a more nuanced understanding of what a passage may mean, particularly as sometimes the connotation of a word today may be different from when the verse was translated. When we read with our own cultural connotation, we may be reading something into scripture that was never intended.

There are lots of parallel Bibles out there that contain several translations in one (pretty big!) book, but that's not a necessary purchase. You can search multiple translations online. Biblegateway.com has most of the common ones and some not so common as well. A personal favorite translation of mine for study is the Amplified version. It's not so much a read out loud version, but it gives alternate ways certain words can be translated, so that you get several possible or deeper meanings of a passage. If you want an alternate translation on your bookshelf for study, it's a good place to start.


