The season of Lent is often confusing for people in 21st century western culture ... partly because our messaging, as the church, is often confusing. To begin with, Lent begins the day after Mardi Gras (literally "fat Tuesday"). The idea is that after a celebration of excess, we repent from that attitude and spend the next 40 days in symbolic fasting (by giving up something we like very much), as we remember the journey of our Savior to the cross of Calvary. See what I mean? When we say it out loud, that all sounds a little confusing to someone who may not grasp some of the deeper meaning behind the Lenten season. I guess my question is "Do WE grasp the deeper meaning behind all of the cultural add-ons to this season?" For us, as believers, we have a responsibility to be ambassadors of a risen Savior who died for our sin because we are simply not capable of atoning for our

own shortcomings ... sin. When we fail to achieve the standard God set for us, we have a couple of choices...

- 1) Be like many other religions and seek to do enough "good things" to "balance the ledger" ... that is make up for the times we fail to meet God's standard. FYI, this choice leads to a life of frustration and constant comparison to other people ... and is doomed to ultimate failure!
- 2) Choice number two is to receive the unconditional love and forgiveness that God extended to us through His Son, Jesus. As such, we recognize that unworthy though we may be, His love for us allows us to be overcomers!

My prayer is that you will fully embrace choice number two!
